2023 Update

Last year was another growth year. Our on-going Help us Grow campaign took in over \$90,000 so far, our 3 events over \$50,000. Separate from this success, income is up 15% which is great news. Admin costs are at 5% of our income which is very reasonable. Our spending on families in need is up 6%. The adults we have served is up 30%, children are up 4% and visits are up 3%.
